

Women's Equality Day Event with Mary Sanderson 8/26/14

"Is Women's Equality a Pre-Requisite for Human Survival?" is the topic of a Women's Equality Day Conversation with Mary Sanderson Tuesday, August 26, 2014 at Many Ways of Peace in downtown Eagle River. The event starts at 7PM.

Sanderson will discuss how women's work and common sense can create positive futures in the context of a broader discussion of how women may participate in healing our world from war and destruction. A member of the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom (WILPF) for more than 35 years, Sanderson will share highlights of the recent WILPF National Conference.

Sanderson lives in DeForest, WI and works as a Spanish Medical Interpreter following retirement from the US Postal Service. "I continue to explore edges, build bridges, be curious and awestruck about our life on earth," Sanderson says.

The August 26th program is the 6th annual Women's Equality Day event at Many Ways of Peace. In 1971, Congress designated August 26 of each year to commemorate the 1920 ratification of the 19th amendment to the constitution—the culmination of a massive, peaceful civil rights movement by women that had its formal beginnings in 1948 at the world's first Women's Right's Convention in Seneca Falls, New York.
